Officers of the Department of State.

Sirs:-

Under date of January 18th, 1909, the Senate agreed to the following Resolution:

"Resolved, That there be prepared, under the direction of the Committee on Foreign Relations, a compilation of treaties, to include all treaties, conventions, important protocols, and international acts to which the United States may have been a party from Seventeen hundred and seventy-eight to March fourth, nineteen hundred and nine, and such other material pertaining to treaties as may be recommended for insertion therein by the Secretary of State."

In pursuance of the foregoing Resolution, Mr. William M. Malloy, Clerk of the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, has been designated to prepare the new compilation of treaties, conventions, etc., referred to in the resolution.

You are hereby directed to co-operate with Mr. Malloy in every possible way in order to facilitate him in his work in connection with the proposed compilation.
