The United States shall in nowise be bond to any action under any provision of this treaty except through representates appointed and acting under authority of Congress.

The United States shall not be boundin respect to any matter or thing pertaining to the execution of the treaty or in espect to the league of nations except through representatives appointed and acton authorized under the authority of the Congress of the United States.

Upon all matters affecting the conduct of the war and questions of policy relating thereto, the War Council shall confer, consult, and cooperate with a Congressional Joint War Committee to be composed of three senators and three representatives, at least one in each case to be of the minority party, to be appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Espresentatives, respectively, upon nomination by the respective party cancuses.

- (6) Inclusion of China (when stabilized) and A Russia (when it has a conscionable government) to the considered later.
