## URSINUS ATHLETES TO HONOR RETIRING COACH

Miss Eleanor Frost Snell, head field hockey coach, professor of physical education and coach of many other womens' sports at Ursinus College, Collegeville, Pa. will be honored at a testimonial dinner on Friday, May 22, at the Holiday Inn of Valley Forge, Pa.

Miss Snell, who has never had a losing hockey season in 38 years and the owner of an incredible 191-60-29 lifetime hockey coaching record (48-2-1 over the past eight seasons) is retiring at the end of the current school year.

Her teams, known affectionately as "Snell's Belles", have produced more All-American field hockey players than any other college team, in any sport, in the nation. Of this past years' first team All-American field hockey squad, five of the 11 picked were coached by Miss Snell.

Miss Snell joined the Ursinus faculty in 1931. She came to the college with a B.A. from the University of Nebraska and an M.A. from Columbia University after teaching in Fort Madison, Iowa; Denver, Colorado and Northern State Teachers College in Marquette, Michigan.
