

Dear Wilson:

I have your letter of the ninth. Matters are moving very slowly in relation to diplomatic appointments. I think you should, no matter how distasteful, interest some of the Senate and political leaders in your case. This does not mean that I will not do everything I can in the matter. I will do so; but unless someone like Senator Knox takes a personal interest I fear very little will be accomplished.

Fred and I have often spoken of you, and are both ready to do what we can.
