My dear Moore,

I am tremendously impressed with the conviction that everything should be done to promote a close and lasting Entente of the English speaking peoples. I am also impressed, as I know you must be, with the dangerous menace of our diplomacy by high-fallutinism, sentimentality, and diseased liberalism. These traits show themselves sometimes in official utterances about small countries whose sanctity, to my mind, is entirely in proportion to their worthiness.

Will you forgive me for enclosing you a couple of articles of mine on these subjects? My sole excuse is the importance of the subjects, not the merit of the discussion.
