My dear Mr. Moley,

My friend and neighbor, Dr. Charles A. Beard, volunteered the suggestion that he would like to give me a letter of introduction to you whenever I might go to Washington. Inasmuch as I seem never to go to Washington nowadays, I am treating Dr. Beard's proposal as an introduction.

My object in writing is to ask you to read the enclosed memoranda of some of my reflections upon American policy, more particularly foreign and economic policies. I am venturing to enclose also copy of my letter of May 22 to the President and of a memorandum on Far Eastern policy which accompanied it. The other enclosures with that letter are at the White House in case you care to consult them.
