The President,

Washington, D. C.

My dear Mr. President,

Allow me to express my heartiest approval of your action in sending American forces to Iceland and in your expressed determination to keep command of the seas from our enemy and to deliver the goods to Britain.

Security of all the English-speaking peoples is mutually dependent, and the hope of the world is their cooperation and permanent alliance.

Bold leadership and vigorous action will be supported by all who are informed, unprejudiced, and patriotic. The nation's course is clear. The purblind and illogical propaganda of appeaser, isolationist^s, and worse must be ignored by those who bear the awful responsibility for America's fate.
