American Film Institute Celebrates 100 years of American Moviemaking

To commemorate 100 years of American movie making, the American Film Institute has compiled a list of the top 100 American made films. Chosen from a list of 400, these films were evaluated on criteria such as critical recognition,

major award winners, popularity over time, historical significance and cultural impact. A panel of 1500 leaders of the American movie community voted via secret ballot and the result is the AFI's top 100.

The Media Services Department currently has 76 of these titles including all of the titles in the top twenty-five! The top twenty-five films are:

Ursinus College Archive's Video Cataloging Project

For the past year, staff of the Myrin Library have been working on a cataloging project involving video tapes in the College Archives. These videos include events such as Airband competitions, baccalaureate and commencement ceremonies, Founder's Day convocations, past admission videos and even Mr. Ursinus events. There are also video recordings of various speakers that have visited the college, such as Ann Landers, John Updike, Victor Cruz, Charles Gibson, Joyce Carol Oates, and Cornel West.

The videos being cataloged in this project highlight many aspects of life at the college and would be of interest to anyone in the Ursinus College community. To view a complete listing of these archive videos cataloged thus far, use the keyword searching function of the Myrin Bibliographic System's online catalog. Enter the search: fi ursinus and videorecording.

The project is an ongoing one and there are many remaining to catalog. This collection is located in the Ursinusiana Room of the Myrin Library. A-V Systems Work Completed in Olin Auditorium

The long awaited upgrade of the audio visual systems in Olin Auditorium has been completed. The Daveland Company has been on campus for the past two weeks installing the major components of the new system. The centerpoint of the new system is an Electrohome Vistapro Plus video projector. It has an ANSI lumen output of 1300, compared with 200 of the existing projector that was installed in 1990. This new projector is nearly 6 times brighter than the original projector. A new podium, with integrated videocassette player and CD player, color remote panel, and user friendly computer interface has also been installed. The sound system in the auditorium will be adjusted for optimal performance, as well. The new videocassette player has a built in time base correction device that will allow us to continue to utilize our aging video collection. Users of Olin Auditorium will see an improvement in the quality of both the audio and video images. The video image is bigger, brighter and clearer. This upgrade will greatly enhance both academic and lecture programs.
