Our Waterbury Chapter of Defend America is, I think, about to amalgamate with your organization locally; and on November 16th we expect to have a very important rally, I think under Waterbury and / State auspices, and with labor union and church representation.

We need the requested information at the earliest possible moment in connection with the preparations; and I shall be very grateful if you will kindly have it hurried to us.
