The Surgeon General directs me to say that I agree with the point of view expressed in your letter of February 21st which has awaited my return to Washington. I think it is very important to promote in every practicable way the four lines of educational effort which you discuss. I am referring your letter to Lieut. Clarke for preparation ^(a memorandum) for the Committee on Civilian Co-operation and the Council of National Defense.

I recently sent Lieut. Clarke to Atlantic City to a conference called by Commissioner Claxton of the United States Bureau of Education. Lieut. Clarke will communicate with you later if I am away from Washington. Your interesting article in the Public Ledger under the title, "The War on the Unborn," has been noted in this connection.
