NATIONAL BOOK AWARDS

-WINNERS AND FINALISTS

Each year, the National Book Foundation announces the winners of the National Book Awards to recognize "books of exceptional merit written by Americans." Besides the Awards, the Foundation seeks to involve Awards winners with underserved communities. Outreach programs that foster this involvement include: a Summer Writing Camp, at which aspiring writers attend workshops with National Book Award winners; the Family Literacy Project, a program for at-risk students and their families in New York City that encourages expression, through reading and writing, about family life; and Pleasures of Reading, which brings NBA winners to rural and inner-city communities for weeklong residences.

To find those National Book Award titles that are in Myrin's collection, use the Catalog QuickSearch found at the top of the Library's website at http://myrin.ursinus.edu and type:

in the field box and then click on "Subject." Titles can be found under the year in which the Award was received and by the category (Fiction, Nonfiction, Poetry, etc.).
