Dear Mr. Huntington-Wilson:

I wish that we might use the letter to Senator Pitman. Thanks for sending it and I am taking the liberty of keeping it for future reference. We have long maintained a policy of not publishing open letters and I anticipate that you might not want the letter used as an article. I note, however, that you have stated to Senator Pitman that you may offer the letter for publication. If under the circumstances we are authorized to revise the letter in article form and perhaps shorten it a little, I will offer it to our Sunday news editor.

I was sorry, too, that you could not attend the meeting of the Navy League and I will look forward with pleasure to seeing you when you are again in New York. Incidentally, the Navy League meeting was one of the best in recent years.
