To the Editor of the New York Times:

I should like very much to know why the isolationists want to cripple France and Great Britain, by retaining the embargo, and so make it much more likely that American boys must fight later on; also, how it happens that Hitler, Stalin, the isolationists (and Father Coughlin) are all agreed in opposing repeal of the embargo. And I should like to know who finances Mr. Hamilton Fish's "Keep Us Out of War Committee", which floods the country with expensive propaganda against repeal of the embargo, and why.
