There has been a tremendous demand for the speech. It could not have gone off better in the Senate, had absolutely undivided attention and have had so many demands for it that I have already distributed practically fifteen hundred copies, many Senators asking me for fifty to one hundred copies for distribution in their states. I suppose you observed the publicity it received in New York, which was rather unusual, as they did not get the speech until the delivery had begun.
