Dear Mr. Wilson:

✓ The Secretary approves your recommendation that Mr. Clark be appointed Agent in the Alsop case. He also approves the suggestions about the personnel of the Solicitor's office except as to the appointment of Mr. Armes.

✓ He says it is all right about Mr. Knapp.

✓ In regard to the Honduras matter the Secretary does not think it is necessary to do any thing further for the present.

As you request, I am sending you the papers in the Liberman matter. Also the memorandum ^{in regard to} Dr. Wright's compensation which has been approved with your suggestion as to date, and the memorandum about printing the letters of introduction which is not approved.

The Secretary is better but has to keep rather quiet.
