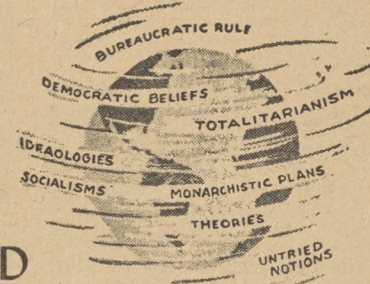
recover. But one of these days all hell will break loose and the American troops will find themselves where Tokyo once was.
