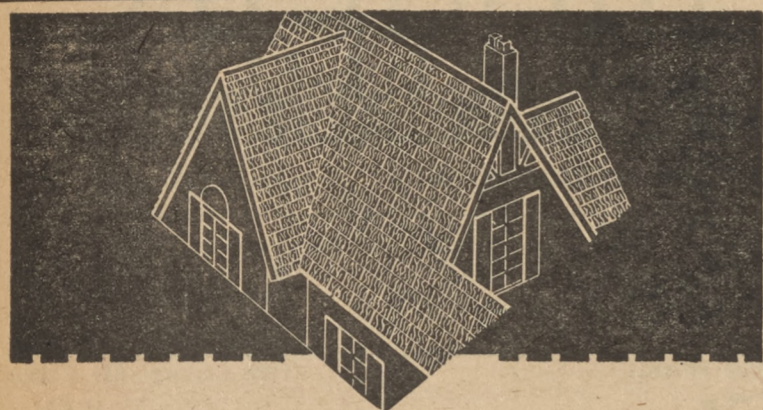

Following the business session an interesting movie on hunting dogs will be presented by Fred Eurich, chairman of the entertainment committee.

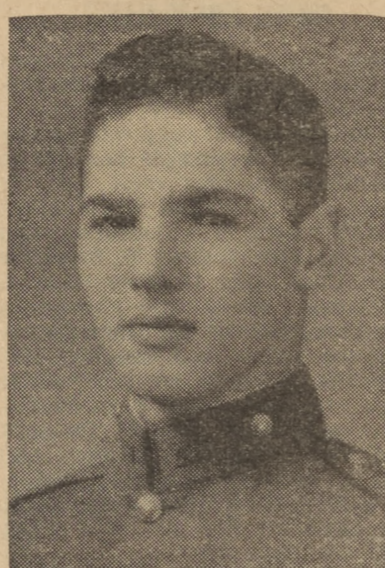

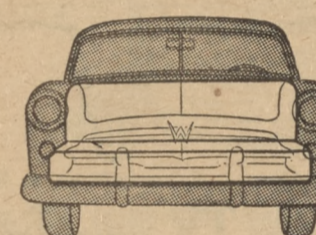
