Re: Letter from Dr. Beyer

In his letter, Dr. Beyer states:

- 1) The dowsing problem has been understood as "exactly physical" in nature;
- 2) The dowsing rod is practically useful in various areas.

He demonstrates the latter through examples, gathered also from the experiences of others but primarily from his own practical experience as a field-tested dowser. As evidence, Beyer's document "My Successes as a Dowser" is attached.

The entirety is meant to be considered as a supplement to the petition of the Reich Association for Dowsing. In this respect, I refer to the viewpoints addressed in my assessment.

Should the need arise from the circumstances to employ proven dowsers in the areas of economy and military before the final organizational regulation, which is planned for the period immediately following the end of the war, I propose that in accordance with the "Ahnenerbe" transitional provisions be made to determine for this period a selection of dowsers and their area of work.
